

**EXTENSION NO. 69
PANAMA CITY, FLORIDA
DECLARATION OF STATE OF EMERGENCY
HURRICANE MICHAEL**

WHEREAS, on October 7, 2018, Governor Rick Scott issued Executive Order 18-276, declaring a state of emergency for certain counties, including Bay County, for Tropical Storm Michael;

WHEREAS, on October 9, 2018, the Panama City Commission adopted Resolution No. 20181009.1 that declared a State of Emergency and approved and authorized the Mayor to sign a Declaration of State of Emergency due to Hurricane Michael which could affect life and property of the citizens and the natural environment of Bay County during the pendency of the emergency;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 252.38 Florida Statutes, the limitation of an emergency declaration is seven (7) days, which may be extended in seven (7) day increments as necessary;

WHEREAS the Declaration of State of Emergency is hereby extended; and

WHEREAS, conditions continue to exist requiring the extension of the initial Declaration.

NOW THEREORE, as Mayor of the City Commission of Panama City Florida and in accordance with the provisions of the State of Florida Office of the governor Executive Order Number 18-276; and as amended by Executive Order 18-277; and extended by Executive Order 20-23, 18-360, 19-33, 19-98, 19-134, 19-176, 19-207, 19-261; and Chapter 252.38 Florida Statutes; and Resolution No. 20181009.1, I hereby promulgate the following extension to the initial Declaration.

1. A state of local emergency continues to exist within Panama City due to the effects of the Hurricane Michael.
2. The initial Declaration of State of Emergency signed on October 9, 2018 and extensions thereof are hereby extended for a period of seven (7) days.
3. As a result of this extension, the Declaration of State of Emergency extends continuously from October 9, 2018, through February 11, 2020 inclusive.
