

City of Panama City – Proposal for Disaster Recovery Support Amendment 11

On December 11, 2018, the City of Panama City passed a resolution awarding Hagerty Consulting a time and materials (T&M) Professional Services contract for disaster recovery services. While the need for the initial contract and request for proposals was initiated due to the emergent needs from Hurricane Michael, this contract is not Hurricane Michael specific but for all disaster recovery services within the period of performance. The total value of that contract was \$7,000,000.

The contract amount was derived from an estimated amount of damage that would be reimbursed by the FEMA Public Assistance (PA) program through Section 324 Management Cost grants from Hurricane Michael. Hagerty is now supporting the City with Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) project development and management.

Hagerty is seeking to increase the contract amount by **\$109,250.00** to provide continued disaster recovery support for the Panama City Neighborhoods Plans including St. Andrews and Harrison Avenue, grant development and programmatic support for the Hurricane Loss Mitigation Program (HLMP) grant and a multi-faceted business outreach campaign focused on hurricane recovery initiatives. The new contract totals **\$16,962,086.59**.

Proposed Scope of Work

Hagerty proposes the following scope of work to support disaster recovery initiatives and grant management.

1. Panama City Neighborhoods Plans Parking Study for St. Andrews.
2. Panama City Neighborhoods Plans walkable/livable study and conceptual design for Harrison Avenue.
3. HLMP grant development and grant management for the installation of lightning protection systems at City Hall as well as occupied and operationally critical buildings at both the Millville and St Andrews WWTPs.
4. Provide a multi-faceted business media outreach campaign to ensure that business currently operating in Panama City, as well as corporations who could potentially choose to open up operations, become aware of the City's business-friendly economic climate.
