



MARINAS DAMAGE REPORT

DECEMBER 11, 2018

The purpose of this report is to highlight the massive impact that Hurricane Michael had on our City marinas. The devastation is significant and the process to clean up and recover is slow and tedious.

This is a phased process that begins with the salvage operations that we are currently doing at both marinas. Next, we will be going into the assessment phase to evaluate the condition of the marinas above and below the surface to be able to discuss future use options.

DAMAGES



The City had to shut down the PC Marina following Hurricane Michael because of the significant damage to the parking area, railing, and sidewalks along the marina. It caused very unsafe conditions with the broken concrete and exposed electrical.

PC SHIP STORE



The PC Ship Store suffered significant damage and is closed. The dumpster went through the store from the front and out the back.

The PC marina staff is currently working out of a mobile office tending to tenants, insurance/salvage companies, Coast guard, and FWC. We have reimbursed prepaid slips and formally terminated all lease agreements at the marina.

We are helping tenants where we can using the pump out boat. The USCG has the marina basins boomed off.

DAMAGES



The St. Andrews Marina sustained damages to all docks and pilings as well. The commercial dock suffered the least amount of damage and we are able to keep the commercial vessels up and running.

SNUG HARBOR



The City has a lease with Morgan Marine to use as a staging ground to either haul boats to Copart Storage yard to be auctioned off or to Bay County landfill to be destroyed.

Update: Morgan Marine said they have pulled about 25 pilings (out of 80) as of 12.6.18. Process has been hampered by weather, winds and tide.
